### Mission

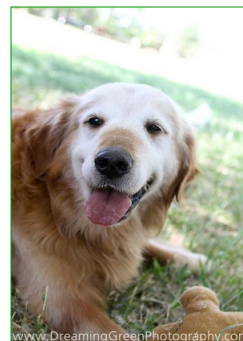
Six to eight million pets enter animal shelters each year, according to the Humane Society of the United States. Ultimately, half (4 million lives) are euthanized as animal shelters do not have the capacity or means to humanely care for them. Only about 5,000 shelters exist to help these animals, Animal House is one of them.

Animal House Pets & Grooming, Inc., located at 1104 W. Vine Drive in Fort Collins, Colorado opened in March of 2007. Established as a 501c(3) non-profit animal shelter and grooming facility, Animal House has saved over 1,700 lives to date.

We provide support to 25+ open-admission shelters who are overburdened by pet over-population and lack of resources. At Animal House we give them that precious resource - time. Together with the community we are saving one life at a time.

This successful program has helped to save over 1,700 lives and provides a much needed service both to the animals and our communities.



**Youth Education** - One of the most important things we can teach our youth is empathy and compassion. Learning this through hands-on volunteering and informational tours, Animal House is proud to give children a cause for giving.

## Financials

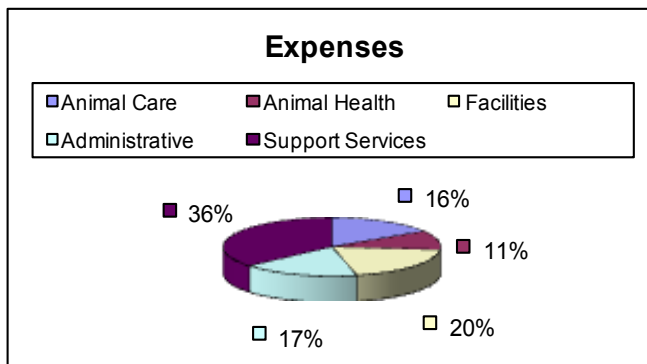
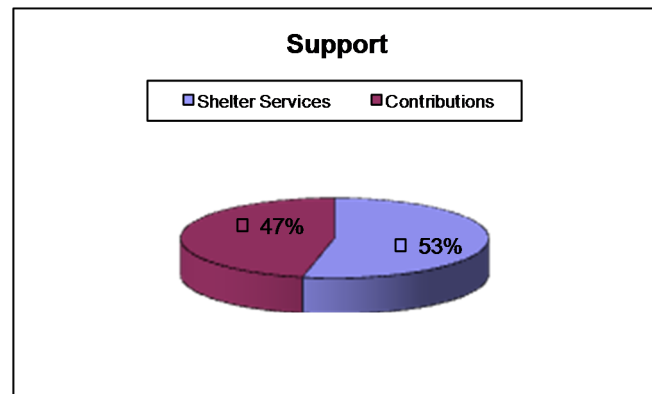
